-Discuss the following questions with your parent.

-Write a 1-page essay that includes your answers to the following questions and any insights you gained during your discussions with your parent.

1. What is the difference between thinking of yourself as an heir – that is, as a son or daughter of God – versus as a “subject” or “member” of a kingdom?
2. What are some ways that people hurt others when exercising their free will in a selfish manner?
3. What does Baptism do for us? ****Leader Note:** Two principal effects of this sacrament are (a) the removal of both Original Sin and personal sin, and (b) sealing with the Holy Spirit. At your Baptism, when God saved you and marked you as his, you became a “new creature” in Christ. Through Baptism, you became part of the Church, the body of Christ (see CCC 1262, 1265).
4. Matthew 28:19 says, “Go, therefore, make disciples of all nations; baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.” What does this teach us about Baptism? ****Leader Note:** see CCC 1234-1245
5. What are some of the symbols used in Baptism? ****Leader Note:** see CCC 1234-1245
6. What do these symbols mean? ****Leader Note:** Water (washing); oil (anointing/sealing with the Holy Spirit); candles (light of Christ); white gown (purity); going in and out of the water (dying and rising).
7. What can you do this week to live more fully and publicly as a child of God?
